The Katandra Special School

Katandra School is a specialist school that provides an exemplary range of programs for students with a mild intellectual disability. All their students have individual programs catering for their unique needs and based upon their individual strengths.

In 1959, the Department

purchased Kilvington Baptist Girls Grammar School, conveniently situated near the Ormond Station, for a special school to service that area. The school was opened in May 1959 with an enrolment of 57 children in 5 groups. The original school comprised a two-storey attic type structure and a wooden block of three small classrooms. In 1961, an adjoining house was purchased and extensively renovated, when additional facilities included two domestic rooms, an assembly hall, and a speech therapy room. Next year 105

children in eight groups attended.

Adopting recommendations, in the Scottish Report, Ormond Special became a junior special school in 1965.

In 1978 an adjoining solid brick house was purchased and serviced the school as a community/tutorial block. This house now operates as the junior section of the school. During the early 1980's major renovations were carried out at the school.

Ormond Special School changed its name to Katandra School in 1992.
