Since then, most RI Presidents have had their own themes, including: *Help Shape the Future* (1958), *Kindle the Spark Within* (1962), *Reach Out* (1978), *Enjoy Rotary* (1989), *Sow the Seeds of Love* (2002), *Celebrate Rotary* (2004) and this year's theme: *Lead the Way*.



"This will be my theme and an affirmation of my belief in the power of Rotarians to change the world, one positive act at a time," said 2006-07 RI President Bill Boyd to his District Governors in describing his theme.
