

## Rotary etiquette: Your questions answered

**Q: Is fruit salad with thickened cream considered a healthy dessert? And is it polite to push the thickened cream to one side? The same question could be asked of pumpkin. JL.**

**A:** Dear JL, It's very difficult to push pumpkin soup to one side. As for fruit salad with thickened cream, it depends upon the type of cream. There are some types of cream that are very good for your health, such as anti-wrinkle cream, haemorrhoid cream, sun cream or nappy cream. I'm not sure that any of them should be thickened or taken with fruit salad however. Stick to the cream by itself and push the salad to the side—a much safer option.
