He has handed over M\$1.5 in food and clothing and bedding and Metcard tickets etc in the last 8 years and his agency has no salary or overhead expenses whatsoever.

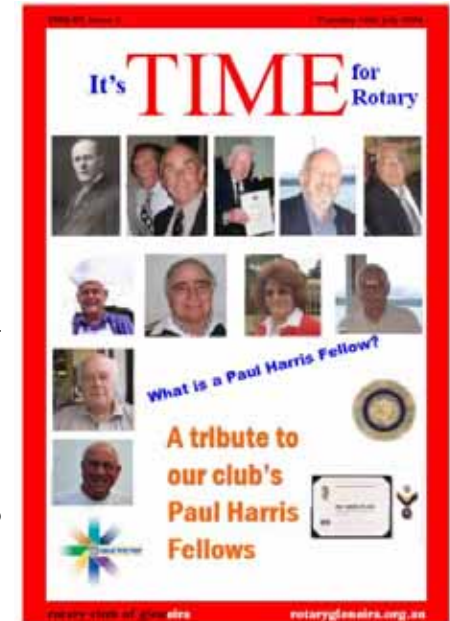
