As he grew older, his love of dance extended to funk, hip hop, jazz and ballroom. At the age of 17, he started dancing professionally. Paul admits that one of the things that attracted him to dancing in the early days was the number of girls in dance classes. "I remember walking into this studio and there were all these girls and I was the only boy, I thought, 'Wow! This is the place for me!'" Paul appeared on the ABC TV show *Strictly Dancing*. His range of dance skills and energetic performances were a big hit with audiences and he ended up finishing in third place with partner Rachel Anderson. His other **achievements** include: **runner up in the 1999 Singapore International Professional Latin, runner up in the 2005 Crown Casino Professional Latin and winner of the 2003 Southern Cross Professional Latin. Paul and his partner Cheryl** recently returned from 18 months dancing and teaching on the world's number one cruise-line where they wowed audiences with their sizzling performances and exciting lessons. Paul sailed to over 40 countries and danced in two hurricanes with over 50 foot seas! Paul's dance and teaching expertise is vast, ranging from Latin, Ballroom, New Vogue, Argentine Tango and Street Latin. Rotarians are encouraged, if visiting the CGMC on Kooyong Road, to enter the main building and on the right wall opposite the reception area is the Honour Board — it is a modern design that looks striking. Rotary Education: The Wheel Emblem

A wheel has been the symbol of Rotary since the earliest days. The first design was made by Montague Bear, a Chicago Rotarian. An engraver he drew a simple wagon wheel, with a few lines to show dust and motion. The wheel was said to illustrate "Civilisation and Movement." Most of the early Clubs had some form of wagon wheel on their publications and letterhead. In 1922 it was decided that all Rotary Clubs should adopt a single design as the exclusive emblem of Rotarians. Hence, in 1923 the present gear wheel, with 24 cogs and 6 spokes, was adopted by the "Rotary International Association." A group of engineers advised that the geared wheel was mechanically unsound and would not work without a "keyway" in the centre of the gear to attach it to a power



Shaft. Therefore in 1923 the "keyway" was added to the design that was adopted as the official Rotary International emblem. It remains so today.
