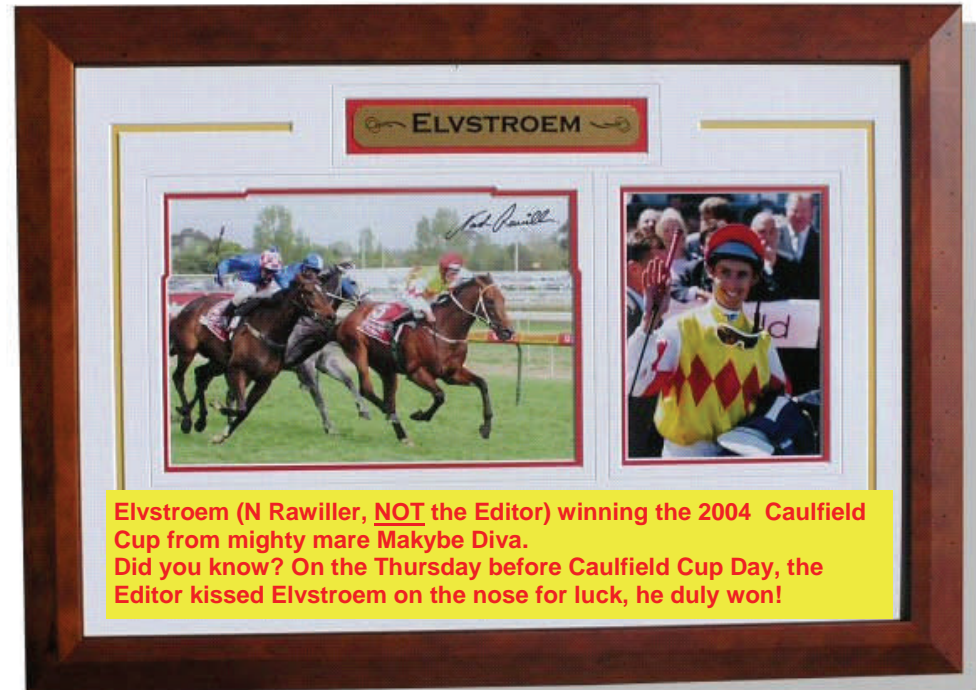

Caulfield Cup — A Little Trivia

The Bulletin was prepared before last Saturday's Caulfield Cup. The Caulfield Cup began 18 years after the first Melbourne Cup in 1879 and was won by **Newminster**.

In 1885 some 41 horses started (the largest field for a major race in Australia) and tragically there was a massive fall with horses and jockey meeting their demise. **Grace Darling** won.

Sobar winning in 1972 was owned by family of Keith and Marilyn. Eleven Caulfield Cup winners have gone on to win the Melbourne Cup in the same year. **Ethereal** was the last to do so (2001).

Bart Cummings holds the training record with 6 winners.

Scobie Breasley holds the jockey's record with 5 wins.
