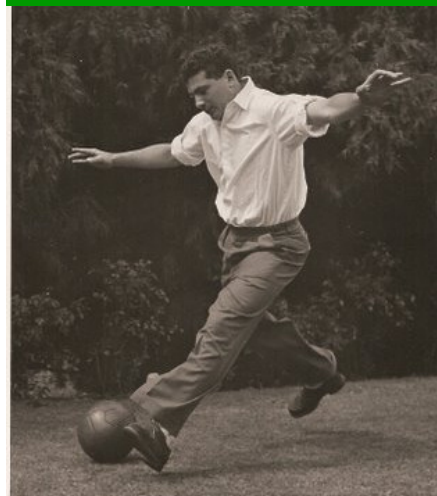
We are joined by our fellow Rotary Club, Brighton Beach with a very special guest: Ray Shaw the inventor of MRI. Set your clocks to this special night.
