Geoff is a Senior Lecturer and the Director of Wound Research Monash University, and Founder of the Wound Foundation of Australia.

Geoff is a past president of the Australian Wound Management Association and a life member of the Wound Management Association of Victoria.

He was the inaugural Secretary of the World Union of Wound Healing Societies and is the Chairman of its Education Commission.

Mr Sussman is an editorial executive of the International Wound Journal, a member of the editorial board of the Australian Wound Management Journal, Wound Care Network, and is chairman of the advisory committee for Post Graduate Wound Care education including Masters of Wound Care at Monash University.

He was awarded an OAM in the Queens birthday Honours for his work in wound care as a researcher, educator and clinician and in the sports of gymnastics and diving.
