The latest information from ShelterBox

Samoa: A logistic planning team is already on the ground and it is planned that 500 ShelterBoxes will be moved in to assist in providing relief.

The Philippines: A logistic planning team is already in country and the plan is to move between 200 to 500 ShelterBoxes into that country.

Indonesia: A logistic team is on standby, access is currently blocked, the airport is closed. Information from Rotarians in the damaged area is that upwards to 1000 ShelterBoxes maybe called for. (We have requested that we be given the ability to ‘piggy-back’ on any Defence/AusAID, flights into the stricken area.)

Vietnam: A major area of focus, the coming week-end could be breaking point for that country and assistance may be required.

ShelterBox is a unique and meaningful way Rotary contributes to the greater human community. It is especially comforting after the recent human tragedy in our Pacific neighbourhood.
