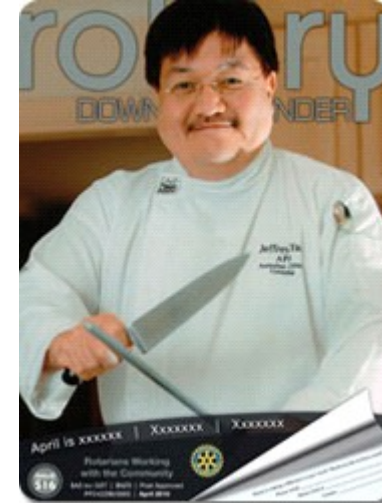

THIS IS A SMALL FAMILY BUSINESS OF APPROXIMATELY 6 YEARS WHICH PROVIDES FRESH GREEK CUISINE TO LOCAL RESIDENTS AND THE BROADER COMMUNITY. THE OWNER AND CHEF - MR DIMITRIOS, KNOWN AS 'JIM', IKONOMOU GETS UP EARLY EVERY MORNING TO GO TO OAKLEIGH MARKET TO BUY FRESH FISH AND MEAT TO COOK GREEK CUISINE FOR THE RESTAURANT'S CUSTOMERS.

'JIM' COMES FROM TRIKOLA ABOUT 41 km SOUTH EAST OF METEORA, KALAMPAKA. THIS IS ONE OF MANY HISTORIC LOCATIONS IN GREECE.

The conglomerate rock at Meteora, has eroded into fantastic peaks upon which medieval monks built monasteries, several of which are still active. The isolated monasteries of Meteora helped keep alive Greek Orthodox religious traditions and Hellenic culture during the turbulent Middle Ages and Ottoman Turk occupation of Greece (1453-1829). In 1988, UNESCO declared Meteora to be a World Heritage Site.

METEORA IS APPROXIMATELY 320 km NORTH WEST OF ATHENS.
