Simon is our “check out chick” at the Supermarkets by Geoff Asher

Members had been scratching their sporrans with excitement when The Gen heralded the speaker's topic as "supermarkets". Fortunately, Simon's expertise was in "superannuation" and the stock market.

RBS Morgans is a stock broking and financial planning firm with offices in all Australian capitals and branches in country Qld, NSW and Vic

Simon was ten years with J B Were before joining RBS Morgans to continue his love of finance and the stock market. He prefaced his presentation with the usual disclaimer that his comments were only general and members should always seek further advice.

Simon discussed current investment

outlooks for Australian and international equities, the bond markets and property, as well as the influence of our 'two-speed' economy.

In explaining why our share market was not reflecting Australia's so-called "strong economy", Simon pointed to the heavy influence of off-shore investors who were constantly spooked by European and US bank and finance crises. He held the view that our equity market would come back to strength in 3 to 4 years (reminding us that the share market had outperformed cash over the longer term)

Simon pointed out that operating earnings per share for US companies were slightly above where they were before the GFC, giving a more optimistic outlook. He also said China's economy was expected to power on as they did not have 'political' restraints and did what they wanted - and they were managing it so well!

In summary, he did not expect the current slump to lead to GFC Part 2, as the conditions were not the same.
