All hands on deck for our Rotarians and friends this week as we help renovate the Children's Playground at local St Mary's Anglican Church this Saturday.

With the help of the local parishioners and (hopefully) a Rotary District 9800 Community Grant, our Rotarians will build a new fence around the playground to make it secure for young children.

St Mary's, which is located in Glen Eira Road Caulfield, was founded in the 1860's and the existing bluestone church was dedicated in 1871. The Jubilee School on the corner of Hood Crescent and Glen Eira Road was built in 1887 AD to commemorate Queen Victoria's Jubilee.

We plan to start the works at 10am on Saturday 13th July. All going well, we will hold a celebratory BBQ at 4pm. Contact Past President Max Sherlock for more information.

Did you know?

St Mary's was active in sponsoring the formation of neighbouring parishes in the late 19th century. The church planting strategy of that time was to establish a local 'chapel of ease', with a group of lay people backing it. These chapels which were supported by clergy and lay readers from St Mary's and other nearby churches, ultimately became parishes in their own right:

- St John's East Malvern
- St Stephen's Elsternwick
- St (now Gardenvale) – originally a chapel of ease of St Andrew's Brighton.
- St Clement's Elsternwick
- Agnes' Glen Huntly
- St Paul's North Caulfield
- St Catharine's South Caulfield
- St Margaret's Caulfield (remained as a district church of St Mary's – now closed)
