ROTARY ADVENTURE IN CITIZENSHIP

Rotary Adventure in Citizenship (RAIC) is an intensive and fun filled week-long program to help prepare young adults for full participation as citizens of Australia.

Each year around 45 Year 11 students (the delegates) are sent by their local Rotary clubs to Canberra. They are taken out of their comfort zones into new places, set amongst new faces and asked to do new things.

For a week, RAIC puts the delegates "inside" Canberra. Run in partnership with the Parliamentary Education Office, the delegates spend a lot of time inside Parliament House in areas not usually open to the public. They often have morning tea with the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

The participants view Question Time and are debriefed by a journalist from the Press Gallery. They learn the difference between a Bill and an Act. They also participate in mock Parliamentary debates themselves.

The students experience the national institutions (War Memorial, Institute of Sport etc) in a way that is more revealing than the usual school excursion can provide. And most importantly, they meet and make friends with young people from all over Australia. Delegates from previous years have said this is one of the highlights of the RAIC program.

This year the Rotary Club of Glen Eira has selected Jayde Glass, a year 11 student at Glen Eira College, to attend RAIC in May.

ROTARY PROJECT OF THE WEEK

Easter Egg Hunt



The Rotary Club of North Ridgeville, OH, USA annually sponsors this event which takes place on the Saturday before Palm Sunday, at the North Ridgeville High School Ranger Stadium.

Weeks before the event, Rotarians spend hours stuffing the plastic eggs with candy provided by the generosity of local businesses, friends and fellow Rotarians. The day finally arrives, and their Rotarians prepare the field and distribute the 10,000 eggs over four separate age groups for hunting; ages 1 to 3, ages 4 to 5, ages 6 to 7, and ages 8 to 9. One hour before the "bell", the gates open and several thousand children, parents and grandparents descend upon Ranger Stadium.

Of course, the Easter Bunny is there to greet the little ones! And when everyone is finally assembled and can wait no longer, the Rotary Bell is rung and the eggs are gobbled up in less than a minute!
