## POULTRY IN MOTION

With sponsorship from the BECK Property Group and working closely with Glen Eira City Council, the Rotary Club of Glen Eira has built a Chicken Run at local Caulfield Junior College.

The enclosure was officially opened on Wednesday 29th October 2014 with Club President Alan Samuel, Sam Beck of BECK Property Group, City of Glen Eira Mayor Neil Pilling, Member for Caulfield David Southwick MP, and Sally Stewart, the Council's Sustainability Support Officer. The need for the chicken run was eggsplained to us by Sally Stewart of Glen Eira Council. At first, we thought it was a bird-brained scheme, but we didn't need to brood over it for very long, and quickly laid into it!

The school gave us free range of what to build. Whilst only a poultry size compared to the normal constructions made by the BECK Group, this cracking structure is certainly an eggcellent one! It took the BECK carpenter just over a day working around the cluck to build it. If you're ever in the vicinity of Caulfield Junior College, we recommend to scramble along and check it out.
